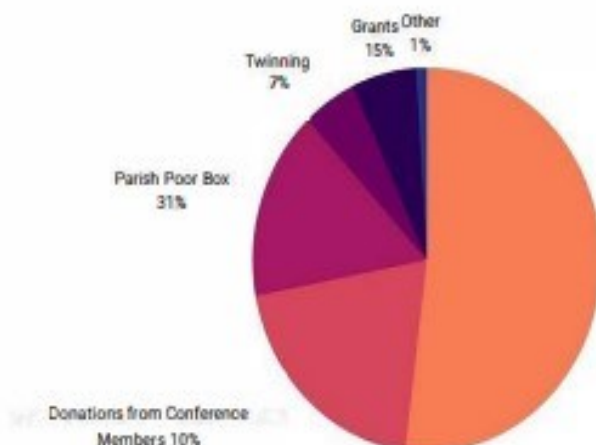

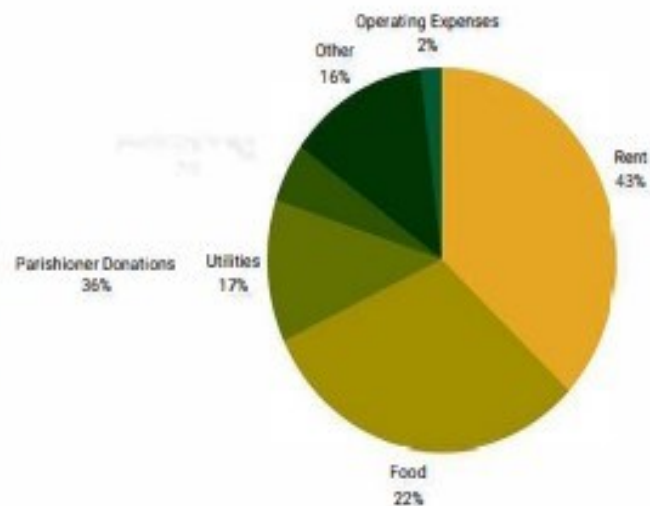

**Thirty-four Active and Associate Members and six Volunteer Translators are showing the face of Christ to neighbors in need in six Fairfax County Zip Codes.**

**Thanks to your generosity, we have:**

- Assisted numerous members of the Latino community in Annandale and Springfield with rent utility assistance, and prepaid grocery cards.**
- Provided entrance fees and weekly rent to almost fifty individuals dealing with addiction so that they might enter or remain in Oxford House sober living residences.**
- In collaboration with other St. Vincent de Paul conferences, and other organizations, helped those in need to pay rent in arrears to avoid eviction; and to pay delinquent utility bills to avoid disconnection.**
- Covered a range of medical and dental bills that have allowed those we serve to receive necessary care.**
- Paid for tools, work clothing, auto repairs, and tuition costs that made it possible for individuals to remain in the workforce.**
- Provided baby supplies to several pregnant Venezuelan refugee women who are being ministered to by the Missionaries of Charity. Also, provide diapers to those families who call on us for help.**
- This Advent and Christmas season, with the support of our Knights of Columbus Council, provided winter coats to over thirty children.**
- Provided sixty-three children and teenagers with gifts and assisted their families with grocery cards for Christmas.**
- Referred numerous individuals who have called our Helpline to Catholic Charities, Food for Others, St. Mary of Sorrows Food Pantry, Fairfax County and coordinated Services Planning, ECHO, ACCA, Facets, and Fairfax FISH, and other organizations for assistance beyond our ability to provide.**
